Writing for a purpose and an audience is an important component to learning/improving to write.



Application Fee

The application fee of \$50 (including GST) is psyable online.

Closing Date

The closing date for applications is Wednesday May 1st 2019.

Examination Date

The examination will be held on: Friday 3rd May 2019.

The examination commences at 9.00cm (students will need to be at Cranbourne Secondary College by 8.45cm). Students are free to be collected from 12.15pm.





What to Bring

Students should bring two 28 or 48 pencils and pencil sharpener, two blue or black binds and an eraser in a clear plastic pencil case or plastic bag.
