Curriculum



NAPLAN commences next week for all students in year 3 and 5. The program will assess skills in four areas, including:

- Reading
- Writing
- Language conventions (spelling, punctuation and grammar)
- Numeracy

NAPLAN tests are just one aspect of school's assessment and reporting process: they do not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance.

You can help your child by reassuring them that tests are just one part of their school program, and by telling them on the day to simply do their best.

Please ensure that students arrive at school on time on Tuesday 15, Wednesday 16 and Thursday 17 of May and make sure they have had a good night's rest before each test day.

What happens if your child is absent from school?

Often parents may think that a day here or there won't make a difference **but** if, for example, your child is away for one day per week they are missing two weeks of lessons **every** term.

There are many studies and research that has been conducted that tells us of the direct link between excellent attendance and high student achievement levels as well as long term health and wellbeing outcomes.

If your child is absent, for any reason, it is very important that you inform the school, in a timely manner, as to the reason for the absence. If you receive a text message regarding a student absence please reply by calling the absence line to explain the reason for the absence.


Sometimes students are anxious about coming to school for any number of reasons. If this is the case please call or come to the school and speak to our Wellbeing Coordinator, Lisa Bloomfield who may be able to assist in this area.

Absences from school should only be taken for legitimate reasons. It is not OK to allow your child to stay at home for their birthday, for a shopping trip or even to go to the airport to greet or farewell relatives.

At times, families travel for holidays or to visit extended family. Whenever possible these trips should be planned in term holidays not during the school term.

In the classroom, teachers plan sequential lessons and regular non-attendance can severely disrupt learning which, in turn, leads to low levels of achievement.

As well as being at school every day it is also very important to arrive at school on time. We encourage parents to be positive about school and to set up routines that support students to get to school on time



If your child is going to be absent please communicate this to the school either by informing the office staff or the classroom teacher.

NAPLAN on paper – information for parents and carers

Why do students do NAPLAN tests?

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life.

Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

The tests provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN tests are just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process; they do not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance.

NAPLAN tests also provide schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are meeting important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

What will be tested?

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum. All government and non-government education authorities have contributed to the development of NAPLAN materials.

How can I help my child prepare for NAPLAN?

Help your child prepare for NAPLAN by reassuring them that the tests are just one part of their school program, and by reminding them on the day to simply try their best. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance.

ACARA does not recommend the use of services by coaching providers or excessive preparation. NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress.

Participation in NAPLAN

All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 are expected to participate in the annual NAPLAN tests.

Students with disability may qualify for adjustments that reflect the support normally provided for classroom assessments. A formal exemption may be granted for a student with significant intellectual disability and/or significant coexisting conditions, or for a student who has recently arrived in Australia and has a non-English speaking background.

Your school principal and your local test administration authority can give you more information on special provisions or the process required to gain a formal exemption.

Will my child sit NAPLAN on paper or online?

Your child will sit the NAPLAN paper tests in 2018.

However, children in some other schools across Australia may sit the NAPLAN online tests this year. Federal, state and territory education ministers have agreed that NAPLAN will move online over the next two to three years. State and territory education authorities will determine when their schools move online.

As students are presented with questions that test the same range of difficulty, regardless of whether they complete the test online or on paper, results for both formats will be reported on the same NAPLAN
