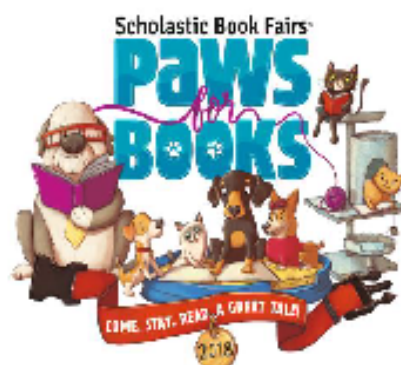
We hope all our families will take this opportunity to not only test your child's vision but also to check the general health of their eyes.

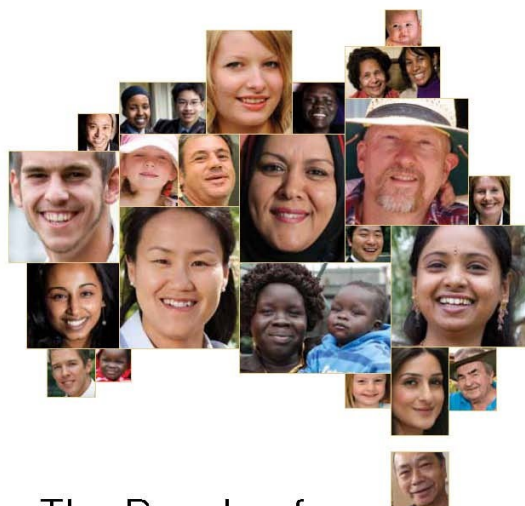
