### PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

As the weather becomes colder, we acknowledge that families with toddlers are increasingly dropping off and picking up students from their cars. Whilst this promotes independence in our students, this practise does need to have some very clear boundaries for the safety of pedestrians and drivers. When crossing Bakewell St and/ or Russell St, we encourage students and parents to use the crossings. One of our students experienced a 'near miss' this morning as he wove his way between moving cars whilst crossing the road. This was very dangerous and fortunately did not result in catastrophe. Parking around the school also contributes to where students are being encouraged to cross the roads.

The following areas are safe for parking—carpark in the church on Russell st, perpendicular parking on Bakewell St, parallel parking without zone restrictions.

Parking in designated driveways IS NOT PERMITTED anywhere around the school. The council has advised they will be



conducting random parking checks and issuing fines to vehicles not parked in approved spaces.

## I See, I Care - Casey Catchments Environment Day

On Thursday 7th June, our Environment Ambassadors had the opportunity to attend an I See, I Care workshop day. They saw City of Casey workers emptying one of the Gross Pollution Separator traps in Endeavour Hills that collects rubbish before it can reach our oceans.

They also had the chance to do some planting, view freshwater marine life and undertake water testing at Frog Hollow Wetlands.



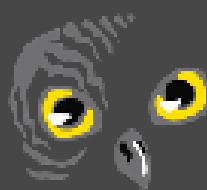
Georgia said, "When the Gross Pollution bag was emptied, it was very smelly. If it wasn't for this bag, all of the rubbish would end up in our oceans and hurt our marine life. Make sure if you see some rubbish, pick it up and put it into the bin—even if it's not your rubbish!"

Sarah said, "When we were doing the planting, it was hard but fun. We used a Hamilton Tree Planter to help dig the holes into the soil. We had to jump on the tree planter to make the hole so we could plant the sapling trees. I planted two new trees and I hope that the tree will stay healthy and grow strong".

Rhys said, "After the tree planting, we went to the lake and used a small net to collect tiny freshwater marine animals. I was able to find a sensitive marine animal called a mosquito larva fish which was introduced to eat mosquitoes, but it ate other animals instead and now it is destroying the marine animals' habitats".
