PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

Last week Mrs Fernand, Mrs Couacaud and I joined 1100 Principals from across the South East Region at the Annual Regional Principal Conference. We participated in forums where research into **educational trends** and **best practice** were discussed. We shared knowledge and exchanged educational pedagogies with other schools from across the network. We will be using this information, combined with the summary recommendations from our recent review to identify where CPS can make improvements across the school to support all students in achieving their learning goals.

A team of staff from our school are currently participating in a program called RESP—this program is designed to develop our awareness of the needs and challenges faced by families who have come to Australia as refugees. We have combined this with the work we are doing to support our families with English as a Second Language.

Next week student progress <u>reports</u> will be sent to families. Student progress <u>discussions</u> will be conducted early in term 3, giving families time to read the reports and formulate questions.



Translators will be made available for those families who require support to express and receive information relating to student reports. Notices will be sent home providing you with the opportunity to select your preferred day and time slot.

Curriculum

'Learning Talk'

Every two weeks we will be asking families to participate in 'Learning Talks' with their children.

By discussing topics and ideas prior to learning, you will help your children get ahead in their personal learning. Students will follow up in class with activities that are related to their 'Learning Talks'.


Foundation

In Reading, the students are learning the stretchy snake strategy (slowly saying each letter sound to make the word). Students are encouraged to practise this strategy when reading books at home. Students can also identify letters in their home environment and say its name and sound.

Junior

In Reading, students are practising their comprehension strategies such as finding important information in a book or asking and answering questions about a story. When reading with your child at home, encourage them to ask questions using words such as 'who', 'what', 'when', 'where' and 'why'. Don't forget to answer the questions too!









Middle

In Reading, the students are going to be learning about different types of poetry. They will be looking at how different poems are structured and the rules that they follow. While learning about poetry students will be focusing on rhyming words and syllables. Our main focus will on Cinquain and Clerihew poems.

Senior

In Reading, students are learning to identify the author's purpose of a variety of different texts. The 3 main purposes of texts are: to inform, to persuade and to entertain. Students are encouraged to read a wide range of text types including fiction and non-fiction. When reading with your child at home, discuss what the purpose of the text is and have them explain their answer.

Procedural Writing

All students will be learning how to write procedures.

Using **procedural writing** helps you accomplish a goal; it gives instructions for completing both common and complex goals.


