FROM THE OFFICE

Parents can still use the "drop off zone" in Russell St and the students can walk around to the front gate to gain access to the school before 8:30 am.

It is very dangerous with parents parking on Bakewell St and trying to reverse out into the traffic.

'Learning Talk'

Every two weeks we will be asking families to participate in 'Learning Talks' with their children.

By discussing topics and ideas prior to learning, you will help your children get ahead in their personal learning. Students will follow up in class with activities that are related to their 'Learning Talks'.

Foundation -

In the past few weeks during the reading block, students have been using strategies such as stretchy snake (stretching out each sound in a word) and chunky monkey (finding blend sound eg. 'th' 'er') to decode words. We encourage students to continue using these when reading at home as well as looking at the pictures to assist them.

Junior -

In Reading, students have been practising their comprehension strategies. You can support your child at home with these skills by asking them questions about the text, getting your child to retell the story in their own words or supporting them to make predictions or inferences using clues in the text or pictures. Furthermore, to encourage a love of reading, allow your children to select books from the library or at home that they enjoy reading!









Middle -

During reading sessions students have been looking at Author's purpose and text features. We have been discussing why might an author have written the text and what different text features can be found within the text. It would be great to ask similar questions when reading with your child at home. For example; 'what do you think the author's purpose was for writing this book?' 'What different text features can you find in the book?'

Senior -

To support your child with their 15 mins of reading at home every night, encourage your child to sit down and read aloud to you. Ask your child questions about the text they are reading, which encourages them to think deeply about why a scenario has taken place, why a character is acting/feeling a certain way or how they might feel if they were in the characters position. Have your child make predictions about what may happen next and get them to summarise what they have read.

Information Report Writing

Information reports are written to present information about an object, animal, person or place and are written in present tense. They include a **classification**, **description** and a **conclusion**. When writing an information report it i helpful to complete some research and to be knowledgeable about the topic.

Find out why they're not eating their lunch

Many schoolchildren bring their lunch home with them at the end of the day, which can be frustrating. There may be a variety of reasons why your child does not eat all the food in their lunch box. The following suggestions may be helpful:


- The lunch box style your child may have an issue with their lunch container. They might prefer a brown paper bag or want the latest fashion in lunch boxes to be like the other kids. It may be difficult for them to open.
- **Boredom** try to pack a different lunch every day. For younger children, cut the sandwiches in different ways to add interest: for example triangles, squares or strips. You could even use one slice of white and one slice of brown to make a 'zebra' sandwich.
- **Too dry** if they say the filling is too dry, try leaving a sandwich uncut. Some fillings like dips or peanut butter may stay fresher this way. If your child's appetite seems small, offer smaller servings. For example, half a sandwich might be more appropriate than a whole one.
- **Fiddly and sticky** make sure the foods are manageable and easy to eat. Some children are put off by fiddly packaging or don't like getting sticky hands. Fruit can be made easier to eat. For example, remove orange peel or cut a kiwifruit in half and include a spoon in the lunch box.
- **Make other meals count** if your child hardly eats anything from their lunch box despite your best efforts, try to at least ensure they have a nutritious breakfast and dinner. Trust that your child will eat when hungry.


