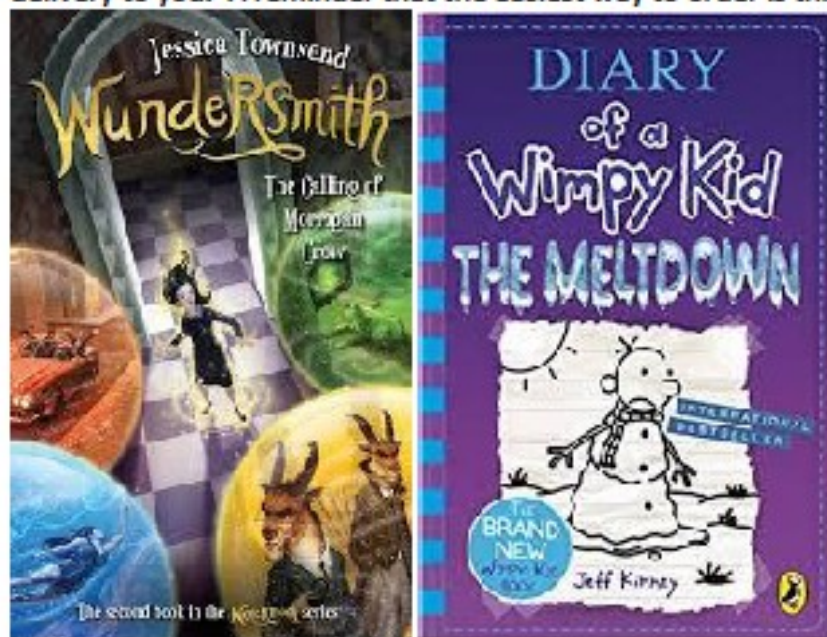
Book Fair
