Dear Foundation parents for 2019,

Welcome to Cranbourne Primary School!

We are pleased to welcome you to our school community and we hope that this is the beginning of a long and positive partnership between us.

Please find enclosed some information to help with your child's start to school next year. If you have any further questions, please do not hesitate to speak to one of our staff.

First day of school:

Girls – Thursday 31st January 2019, 8:50am – 1:00pm

Boys – Friday 1st February 2019, 8:50am – 1:00pm

All boys and girls will then attend school together on **Monday 4th** from 8:50am – 1:00pm.

Foundation students do not attend school each **Wednesday in February (6th, 13th, 20th & 27th)**. You will be required to attend an interview (approx. 40 minutes) with your child on one of these days. These interviews also provide an opportunity for our Foundation team to conduct the Department of Education and Training assessment requirements.

Your child's interview date and time are listed in your child's Transition Pack.

To help your child settle in the learning space, we advise that you bring them in, assist them with their bag and name tag, say goodbye and leave promptly. Prolonging your departure can be upsetting for some children. We ask that all parents have left the learning space by 9.00am, so that our Foundation team can begin the day's learning activities. At the end of the school day, we invite you to enter the learning space to collect your child. Towards the end of Term 1, Foundation students will be dismissed from the building by their teachers and parents will be asked to wait outside.

First 'Full' Day of school:

The first full day of school for ALL Prep students is Tuesday 5th FEBRUARY 2019.

On this day, please ensure your child brings:

- Art Smock
- Library bag
- Take Home Reader bag
- Water bottle
- Snack
- Lunch
- Fruit for Fruit Break

Our School Day:

You can find a detailed breakdown of our school day in your Foundation Information Booklet included in the Transition pack. The first bell of the day goes at **8:50am** and all students are expected to be in the building ready to commence their day at **9:00am**. It is important to be at school on time and we hope this is a habit instilled in your child from day one.

Your child will be issued with a school hat on their first day of school next year, once we have confirmation of your payment for book supplies and school fees.

We hope you enjoy your Foundation year with us and we look forward to being a part of this exciting time!

Dear Parents/Guardians

Cranbourne Primary School is very proud of the quality programs that are in place to cater for the needs and interests of our students. Student charges are a vital part of our school's financial operation and help to support the programs and resources that we provide.

For the year 2019, all stationery items for students will be ordered in bulk and will be delivered to school. There is no requirement for parents to collect book packs to take home, label or return with their child on the first day of school. Instead, all supplies will remain at school to be available as students need them.

By using this method all children will have the same correct books with appropriate lines for their grade level and the same quality equipment. Ordering in bulk through an educational supplier keeps costs for families to a minimum.

As a commitment to our community, we have kept the total for stationery and school fees at a reasonable level.

Your School Council has given careful consideration to the Student Essential Educational Items and their costs for 2019 are listed below.

ICT Licensing and Registration fees	\$30.00
Art and Craft Requisites	\$35.00
Curriculum Consumables, e.g. Science, Maths, Cooking	\$25.00

2019 SCHOOL CONTRIBUTIONS SHOULD BE FINALISED BY THE START OF TERM 1

THEY CAN BE PAID IN FULL OR BY INSTALMENTS ANY TIME BEFORE THEN

For some parents paying school contributions in full at the start of the year can be difficult. We therefore urge you to establish a plan now, which will ensure that the fees are **PAID IN FULL BY THE START OF TERM 1**. Beginning now, if you pay just \$15.00 per week, the entire contribution amount will be paid by the start of term 1. For your convenience payments can be made in a number of ways:

- In full or by instalments
- Credit card payments can be accepted over the counter or over the phone (in full or by instalments)
- By cash, cheque, EFTPOS, credit card or direct deposit - you may make regular direct deposits to spread the instalments over the coming months
- School bank details are BSB: 013 593 Acct no: 499102494 – Make sure to identify your child and write 'Fees'

During the course of next year, students will attend excursions and incursions which are related to their learning and Units of Investigation. These may include such things as Life Education. These events will need to be paid for as they occur throughout the year, and we anticipate the total costs of such events should not exceed \$160.00. The Camping program (Grades 3 – 6) will also be a separate charge (estimated cost approx. \$250).

The Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF) is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities (\$125). If you have not previously applied for the CSEF through Cranbourne PS and you think you are eligible, please contact the school office for an application form. You may be eligible for CSEF if you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent.

If you are anticipating financial difficulty or you would like some assistance with a payment plan we ask that you contact the school immediately.
